The Leopard is an "exotic and solidarity" charity shop where original and good quality secondhand clothes, shoes, bags and other objects are sold at very affordable price to customers from different social backgrounds. This boutique is part of the Relay network which creates employment in rehabilitation at regional level.

Self-managed social space

The Mimir house emerged from the encounter between homeless people and social workers, wishing to develop a space for residence and creation, and who occupied together a municipal building that had

been abandoned for 11 years. Enjoying today a 20-year emphyteutic lease, Mimir is an alternative self-managed space offering cultural and social activities. Mimir also provides solidarity services such as a social luggage, small market and low-cost exchange space.

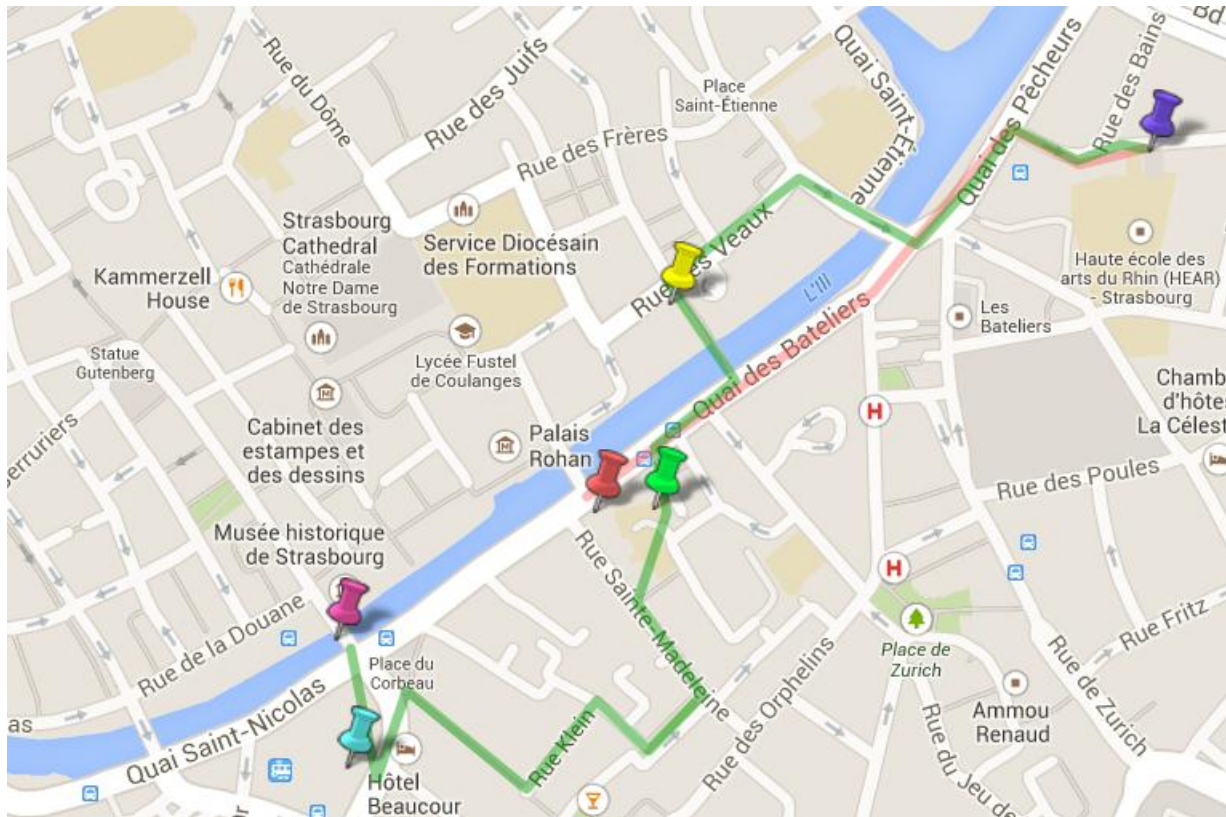

The Youth Club L'étage has been working in many activities with youth at high risk for more than 30 years. A reception centre and a restaurant were opened in 1981 and in 1984, in the city centre of Strasbourg, to establish and maintain contact with vulnerable young adults, often homeless, who rarely frequent the usual places of social action.
